**A BILL**

To direct the Secretary of Education to reissue the solicitation and award the contract relating to the Charting My Path for Future Success project.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Charting My Path for  
5       Future Success Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. CHARTING MY PATH FOR FUTURE SUCCESS**  
2 **PROJECT.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 90 days after the  
4 date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Education  
5 shall reissue the solicitation and award a contract de-  
6 scribed in subsection (b) as if the contract described in  
7 such subsection had not previously been awarded.

8 (b) CONTRACT DESCRIPTION.—The contract de-  
9 scribed in this subsection is the contract that was award-  
10 ed, pursuant to section 664(e)(1) of the Individuals with  
11 Disabilities Education Act (20 U.S.C. 1464(e)(1)), to a  
12 nonprofit organization to carry out the “Charting My  
13 Path for Future Success” project that—

14 (1) aims to help families and high schools to  
15 support students with disabilities to reach their  
16 goals during and after high school, by training edu-  
17 cators to assist such students to—

18 (A) set goals that help build skills to be  
19 successful in school and life;

20 (B) develop action plans related to those  
21 goals; and

22 (C) reflect on their progress toward those  
23 goals and adjust goals or action plans when  
24 needed; and

25 (2) under which, in January 2025, following the  
26 completion of training with the project, 61 educators

1       began to assist 1,600 high school students in 62  
2       high schools in 13 local educational agencies.

3       (c) PROHIBITION OF CANCELLATION OF CON-  
4 TRACT.—A contract awarded under this section may not  
5 be canceled without the approval of Congress.
