

The Atlanta Passport Agency will host a Passport Acceptance Event from 12:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. on Saturday, August 17, 2024, for the Congresswoman Lucy McBath and her constituents. The event will be held at Peachtree Corners Library Branch located at 5570 Spalding Drive, Peachtree Corners, GA 30092.

Appointments must be confirmed. Walk-in appointments are not allowed. There will be no same day books printed at the event. All applications will be process in accordance with the national processing times for Passport Services (routine 6-8 wks., expedited 2-3 wks.).

Passport fees are as follows:

Acceptable forms of payment are money orders or personal checks [payable to the U.S. Department of State], credit or debit cards, and Apply Pay. There will be no cash accepted.

Bring your valid driver's license, plus one of the following as your proof of U.S. citizenship: A previously issued U.S. passport, original birth certificate, or certificate of naturalization.

Each applicant must bring a front and back photocopy of the ID that will be presented at the time of passport acceptance. Local university ID is acceptable for college students.

Applicants are required to provide one recent passport photograph, measuring 2-by-2 inches, on a white background. The Agency will not provide photographs. Applicants may purchase photographs at a local CVS, FedEx, Walgreens, etc.

All applicants must appear in person (including minors). Minors under the age of 16 must appear with both parents. If one parent is not available, a notarized DS-3053 Statement of Consent authorization from the non-appearing parent is required, along with a photocopy (front & back) of the absent parent's ID. You may locate this form on travel.state.gov.

U.S. passport holders who will have less than six months validity on their passports should consider renewing their passports.
